

Justice Ssemogerere Inspires Kabale University School of Law Students

On Wednesday, the halls of Kabale University School of Law (KAB) came alive with inspiration as Justice Karoli Ssemogerere, Resident Judge for Kabale, paid a momentous visit.



The visit, a return gesture to the School of Law's courtesy call upon his arrival in Kabale earlier this year, marked a new chapter of collaboration between the Bench and the budding law faculty.

Nestled in the heart of Western Uganda as the region's only public law school, KAB is steadily scripting its legacy with its pioneer LLB I and LLB II students.

Against this backdrop of promise and ambition, Justice Ssemogerere walked through the lecture halls, exchanging words of wisdom with eager students and commending the passion of faculty led by the Dean, Dr. Charlotte Kabaseke.

He toured the Moot Court Room, a cradle of budding advocates, and envisioned greater synergy between the University and the High Court, already its neighbour and host of the annual Moot Competition. With digital tools and judicial goodwill, he said, the School could open windows for its students to witness capital trials and oral arguments in real time, deepening their appreciation of trial advocacy.

The Dean, in turn, shared her dream of watching the young faculty blossom into an institution with its own grand home. Leading the Judge through the University Library's law section, she gave him a glimpse of the day-to-day world of her students.

Drawing from his own journey, teaching law at Makerere University immediately after graduation, Justice Ssemogerere urged the faculty and students to seize Kabale's unique strategic location and harness Judiciary partnerships to weave international networks that will enrich both curriculum and careers.

His message was clear: the law is not only to be learned but also lived, with courage, curiosity, and connection.
